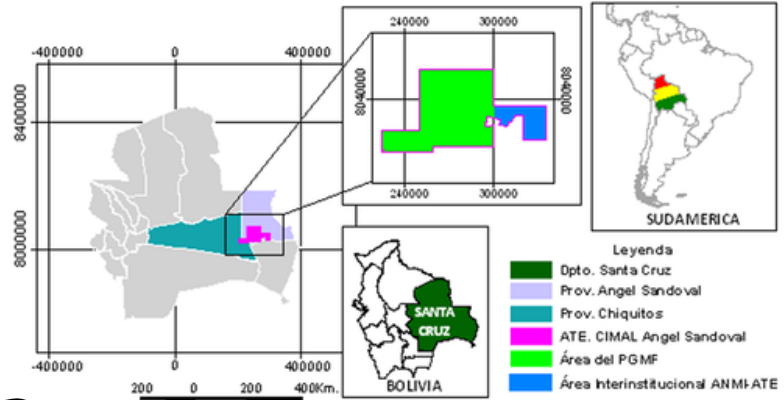


Special Temporary Authorization (ATE)

ANGEL SANDOVAL

The Special Temporary Authorization (ATE), administered by INDUSTRIA FORESTAL CIMAL IMR S.A., is located in Bolivia, in the department of Santa Cruz, in the municipalities of Roboré and San Matías, primarily in the Ángel Sandoval province. It covers an approximate area of 302,929 hectares, of which 78.38% overlaps with the San Matías Integrated Management Area (ANMI), protecting the Chiquitano dry forest. The entire area is part of the jaguar's habitat and contributes to the water stability of the Bolivian Pantanal and the Correcica and La Gaiba rivers.



VERIFIED IMPACTS

SE2: CARBON STORAGE AND SEQUESTRATION

Forest management generates the impact of maintaining carbon reserves with a storage of:

SE3: WATER SERVICE

295,737.3 ha

Well-preserved forests generate the positive impact of maintaining the regulation of water volumes.



SE4: SOIL CONSERVATION

295,737.3 ha

Well-preserved forests without signs of degradation generally have a positive impact on maintaining soil stability and protecting against soil erosion.



SE7: AIR QUALITY

295,737.3 ha

Well-preserved forests have the positive impact of maintaining air quality.

HIGH CONSERVATION VALUES



→ Ecosystem Protection

78.38% overlap within the San Matías Integrated Management Natural Area (ANMI). Protection of the Chiquitano ecosystem, classified as endangered by the IUCN.



→ Wildlife Corridor

100% of the area is part of the natural distribution and projected conservation areas for jaguar populations.



→ Water Regulation

Critical regulation of the regional hydrological process (Correcica River, La Gaiba River, Bolivian Pantanal).
